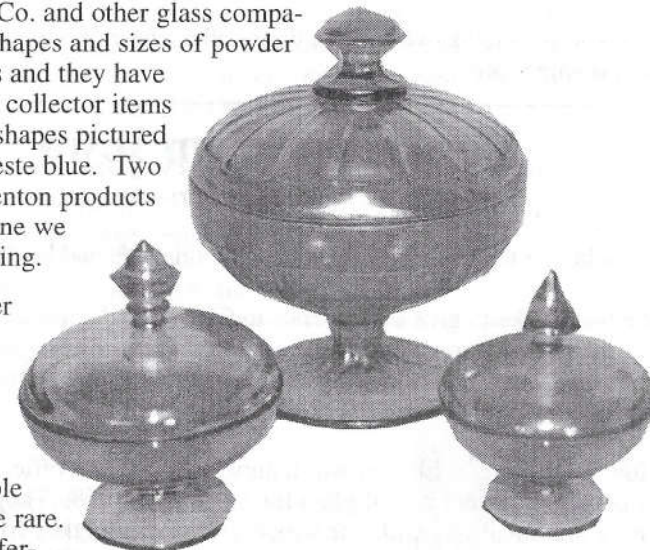

Powder/Puff Jars

Fenton Art Glass Co. and other glass companies made many shapes and sizes of powder jars over the years and they have become cherished collector items today. The three shapes pictured here are all in celeste blue. Two of the three are Fenton products and the smallest one we need help identifying.



The largest powder jar is Fenton's mould #643 and can be found in a multitude of colors. Some colors are readily available and other are quite rare. As a quick size reference the base or foot diameter measures about 3 1/2" and 5 1/4" across the top of the bowl.

The small puff jar on the left is also shown as Fenton's mould #57 in the book "Fenton Glass - The First Twenty-Five Years" by William Heacock. The measurements on this one are 2 1/8" across the foot and 3 7/16" across the bowl. We now have four of the five colors known to us. Celeste blue, Vaseline, Marigold and Florentine Green. The Wisteria puff jar is still on our want list. Other colors may possibly exist. A White one would be nice.

That leaves the petite puff jar on the right. This was a recent purchase on eBay and like many eBay items, it came with a "this was my grandmother's story". It seems that grandma was an old time antique dealer and the legend she told was "this was a salesman's example and quite rare". Well, we can't picture glass jobbers back around 1925 carrying anything but catalogs, but we did want this puff jar enough to pay the price. (Ouch!) We have noticed since then that this individual seems to have other "salesman's samples" for sale.

Fenton did make a little puff jar this size but with a nipple shaped finial. While this little puff jar has a pagoda type finial, it still is a possible Fenton product. The celeste color certainly points in their direction. This measures 1 3/4" across the foot and 2 7/8" across the bowl.

We have what could be considered a fairly large collection of #643 type powder jars. No, they are not all Fenton products. We have thirty-five different examples at present and we are still looking for more. These jars are

from three glass factories, Fenton, Northwood and Diamond. Unfortunately many collectors lump these into one category of glass, stretch. As if stretch glass is a dirty word. In reality these have several types of finishes, including carnival, and very few have a true stretch finish.

If anyone can tell us who made the small puff jar or anything about it, we would appreciate it.

Letter to the Editor

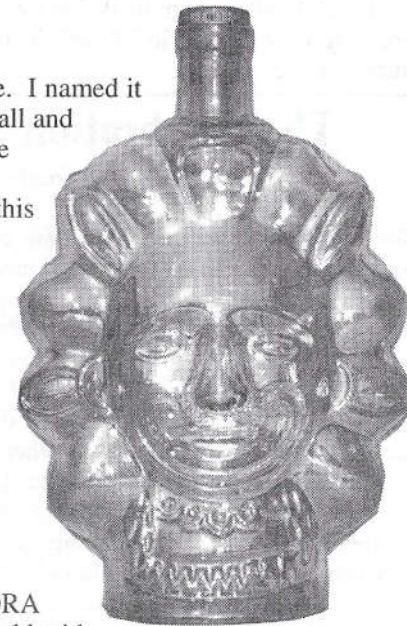
Dear Eleanor:

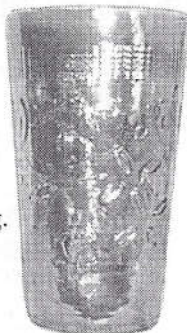

The Celebration Tumbler

Now here's a tumbler that would have come in handy during your New Year's Eve celebration. It has all the proper images molded into it to signify a party occasion. It is a real departure from all other carnival glass tumblers that we are used to seeing.

It is a Jain Glass Works, Ltd. product from Firozabad, India. It certainly is very different from the usual Jain designs that we have heretofore seen on their other tumblers, such as grapevines, peacocks and geometric symbols. Here we have molded into the glass the words "Good Luck" along with party symbols such as balloons and the figure of a small boy. Framing these objects on each side is a design that only can be described as an old fashioned tall hat rack. A celebration indeed.



The tumbler's measurements are 5 3/8" high, 2 1/4" base and 3 1/4" rim. There is nothing on the base. There are two bands consisting of small squares encircling the glass - one 5/8" below the rim and the other around the bottom. The top one is 5/8" wide and the bottom 1/2" wide. The color is a very nice marigold and well iridized. This can be considered a rare tumbler as of this date as only two are known at present in the US. Jain has proved to have been a prolific maker of carnival glass tumblers and vases as hardly a month goes by without someone finding another delightful pattern.

MOTEL — Embassy Suites Hotel, 7640 N.W. Tiffany Springs Parkway, Kansas City, Missouri (At the Kansas City International Airport). Reservations can be made by calling the Hotel directly at 816-891-7788, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. & 7:00 P.M. on weekdays. Ask to speak to Jamie in Reservations, and mention the HOACGA convention. Other times, reservations can be made by calling 1-800-EMBASSY (1-800-362-2779). The FAX No. at the hotel is 816- 891-7513.. If you will need a table(s), (6 ft) for your display or for selling glass, please request it when making your reservations. The table rental charge is \$15.00 per table, for the duration of the convention. Shuttle service is available from the Airport, call the Embassy Suites. **EACH SUITE HAS A WINDOW FOR DISPLAYING YOUR GLASS.**

ROOM RATES — The rate for all suites, except suites 219 thru 226, is \$98.00 per day for single or double occupancy. For three or four occupancy, the rate is \$108.00 per day. The rate for suites 219 thru 226 is \$108.00 per day. The room rate includes a free cooked-to-order breakfast, and a two hour manager's reception every evening, from 6 to 8:00 P.M. **YOU MUST BE A MEMBER OF HOACGA TO RECEIVE THE REDUCED ROOM RATE.**

SMOKING — We have been told by the Hotel personnel that the only place that smoking is allowed in the Hotel is. inside the individual Rooms and in the Bar area.

CONVENTION RESERVATIONS

HOACGA has blocked 185 rooms for the convention, but the block can only be held until April 16, 2001. Please make your reservations before April 16. Heart of America Carnival Glass Association Board Minutes – December 27, 2000

The monthly HOACGA Board meeting was held on December 27, 2000 at the Holiday Inn in Lawrence. All Board members were present.

January Newsletter articles and announcements and general layout were discussed. Information on the 2001 Convention prepared by Bob Grissom and a list of newsletter articles for past five years compiled by Ann McMorris will be included in the January newsletter. Again discussed the best mailing date for the newsletter and consensus the 15th of each month or a few days earlier should be the target date.

Treasurer Ball reported on club income and expenses for 1999 and 2000. Income has decreased in 2000. Expenses have remained about even.

Discussion on combining video tapes of HOACGA seminars and displays to make long play tapes. Some discussion on offering a special price on all video tapes.

More discussion was held on a 2001 souvenir, Bob Grissom has contacted Frank Fenton to obtain input. The Board considered size, availability of moulds, selling price and desirability by collectors. Several items were considered and Bob will go back to Fenton's with these possibilities.

Matters discussed for the 2001 Convention - photographs of room displays and hiring of a professional free lance photographer, criteria for judging of room displays, expanding the categories and judges. Tasting session for selection of menus will be held by the board on January 11 at Embassy Suites, and the board will meet with department managers to discuss various aspects of the convention facilities.

A hospitality room will be sponsored by HOACGA on Friday, January 5, 2001 at The Days Inn Motel in Boonville the night before Mickey Reichel's New Years auction on January 6. Bob Grissom plans on setting up a table with HOACGA info at the Woody auction in St. Louis.

Eleanor reported the FAX machine is very useful in sending information to the printers and she will be working on setting up to receive messages. Board approved addition of disclaimer language in Club News & General Information.

The January monthly board meeting will be held on January 25, 2001 starting at 12:00 p.m. at the Holiday Inn in Lawrence.

HOACGA Club Information

The purpose of the Heart of America Carnival Glass Association is to promote the growth and continuation of the Carnival Glass collecting hobby and to provide support to the many collectors by providing current information about the hobby.

Growth is accomplished by supplying educational information for the collector and soliciting new collectors into the hobby.

A Convention is held annually in April in conjunction with the annual meeting (Convention date always includes the 4th Friday). Some of the activities provided at the convention are:

- Members provide Room Displays with glass from their collection.
- Members are encouraged to bring glass for Sale.
- Educational Seminars are provided by members.
- A Major Carnival Glass Auction is provided.
- The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- **Membership Dues** – \$25.00 per year U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.
- **Educational Series – Book I** – 148 articles with pictures (black and white) on a variety of Carnival Glass Patterns.
- **Educational Series – Book II** – 180 articles with pictures (black and white) of Carnival Glass Tumblers.
- **Educational Series – Book III** – 150 articles with pictures (black and white) of Bon Bons, Bowls, Drinking Vessels, Novelties, Rose

Bowls, and Table Sets. Also included is a listing of 500 rarities.

- **Hartung Carnival Glass Pattern Books** – A set of 10 books identifying Carnival Glass Patterns. These books are a must for all Carnival Glass Collectors, especially for the beginner. These are the only complete set of books available that identifies the majority of the carnival glass patterns. Sketches are in black and white.
- **Pattern Notebook** – A notebook containing sections on Mugs, Table Sets, Rosebowls, Water Sets (including painted sets), Plates (small, regular & chop), Compotes (large, regular & small), Punch Sets and Vases. Each section of the notebook identifies each pattern with a COLOR picture along with information about the Maker and colors of each different pattern.
- **Souvenirs** – Periodically HOACGA makes a souvenir to be sold to members. Souvenirs have been made since 1974, a few of these are presently available. They are listed in the center section of the bulletin. Each year that Souvenirs are made, Whimseys are also made and sold at the convention banquet.

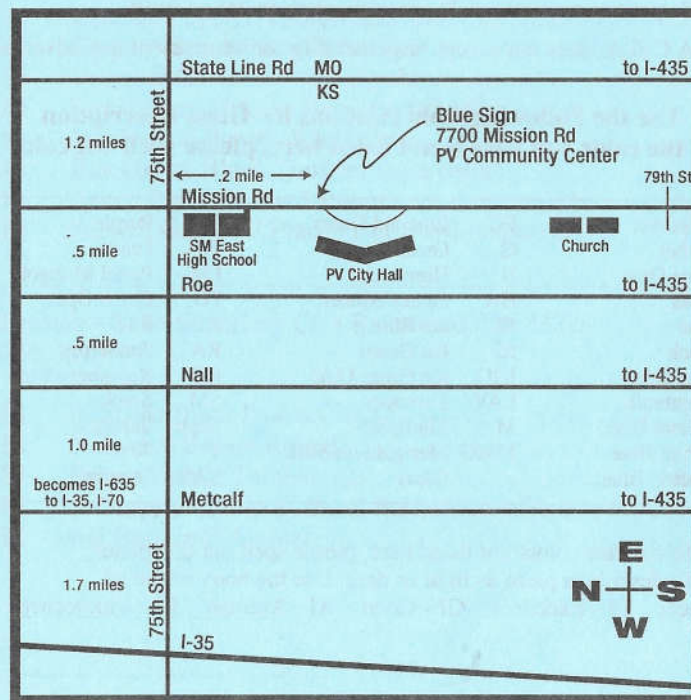
