2001 HOACGA Souvenir

In 1977 the HOACGA Souvenir was the "Good Luck" hatpin holder, in "Flame Red", made by the Smith Glass Co. In 1980, it was the made in "Ice Green" made by the Fenton Glass Co. This year we have asked The Fenton Glass Co. to make the hatpin holder in Vaseline Opalescent. The date will be changed to indicate the year 2001. Not many pieces of Carnival Glass were made in Vaseline and even fewer were made in Vaseline Opalescent. I was at the Fenton factory on February 27th to see the hatpin holder made. I got to see some samples of the color. It is a beautiful piece of Carnival Glass. It has a very nice pastel iridescence and the opalescence is very good. I believe any member will be glad to have one or more of this souvenir. Only 200 to 225 pieces will be made.

The Room Display award, the "Hobnail" spittoon, and the Banquet Table Favor, "Orange Tree" Wine will be in the same color.

When you purchase a Souvenir you get a nice piece of Carnival Glass plus you are helping to financially support the organization. A member can order as many of the hatpin holders as you want.

2001 HOACGA Notebook Insert Vases — 6th Section

The HOACGA Notebook Section for 2001 will again identify vases. This is the 6th and final section on Vases. Another 85 to 90 patterns are reported. This section contains additional Non-U.S. vase patterns, and identifies many of the Brocaded pieces, along with patterns that were not previously reported. With this section, a total of about 425 different vases have been reported. Probably all of these vases are reported in other publications, but no other single publication contains as much information as these six sections. Each different pattern is identified with a colored picture. Even after reporting on 425 different vases, there are still, patterns that are not shown.

This information is only possible with the help of many members that have supplied photographs and other information. This is a good example of what collectors are doing to help promote their hobby of Carnival Glass collecting.

If you do not have all of the previous five Notebook sections on Vases, then you are missing a lot of valuable Carnival Glass information.

Ribbed Tornado Vase

Tornado vases can be found both with a plain background or ribbed background. The Ribbed Tornado vase made by H. Northwood and Company is daringly in a class of its own. Although rather small in size, this one measuring approximately six inches tall, yet this vase pattern stands out in its distinctive style in so many ways. First the descriptive sections with a "twister" pictured on each sector. And the many ribbed background lending its twisting effect to the violent action of a tornado.

Then the iridescence on the amethyst and blue vases are said by some writers to rival early Tiffany, Loetz and Carder art glass. That's not to say that the marigold, green, ice green, the rare white and ice blue versions are any less attractive. None of these vases regardless of the colors change hands frequently. An ice blue Ribbed Tornado vase was sold recently here in St. Louis in the Garth Irby auction for \$3500.



These Tornado vases are listed in the fourth vase section of the HOACGA notebook as #261 through #264. And besides the standard smooth background and scarce ribbed background examples, they are shown both in a whimsy shape and a rare pedestal and footed variant. There doesn't seem to be any indication that these very rare marigold pedestal vases were made by the Northwood Glass Company.

This amethyst vase pictured here does carry the Northwood trademark (N) on the inside bottom of the vase, but like many Northwood patterns all the vases may not be signed. Both the Mordini and Doty price guides refer to two sizes. There is about a half-inch difference in size between the two. Both sizes are pictured on page 105 of the book "Harry Northwood, The Wheeling Years" by Heacock, Measell and Wiggins, and an excellent picture of the three vase styles can be found in the book "Magic and Mystery of Carnival Glass" by the Thistlewoods on page seventy.

Taking into consideration the relative scarcity of these vases today, we would have to guess that the production run was quite short. The lack of advertisements makes it hard for us to put a time line on just when it was made. The fact that the Tornado vases are similar in size to vases like Northwood's Corn vase and the Daisy and Drape vase, that were both popular and apparently good sellers around 1912, could be a clue. Regardless of when they were made, there doesn't seem to be any doubt that today's carnival glass collectors prize these vases and adding one or two in your collection seems to be the goal of many of us.

Little Barrel

These small (approx. 3 1/2" tall) novelty items made by Imperial, certainly answer the need for miniature collectors, and make pretty "fill-in" pieces on anyone's shelf of "pretties"! Marigold is said to be the more prevalent color, but smoke and green Barrels seldom present themselves either. The shade of green can be anyplace between emerald and helios and do not command the prices of marigold and smoke.

Usually quite bright and colorful, some examples have been found to have original paper labels attached to the bottom, indicating the name of a business, or that of a given tavern. Presumably, samples of "brew" were given away in these containers to promote sales....Sometimes a cork stopper fills the opening, but who can say it is the "original"? These Barrels are not advertised in any of the known wholesale trade catalogs of the day, such as Butler Bros.

How often do any of us have the opportunity to purchase one at auction?...Not often, I dare say. A great example of the marigold will sell for as much as the smoke when sold privately, we have observed.....somewhere in the neighborhood of \$250. '99 auction sales report two smoke Barrels sold for \$225 and \$235. Two marigold examples brought \$60 and \$135.....So, "Roll out the Barrel!....Let's have a Barrel of FUN!"



Snow Fancy

With ten inches of snow on the ground in Lincoln, Nebraska, it seems appropriate to write about the Snow Fancy pattern. We bought a creamer in this pattern in an antique shop in our early days of collecting carnival glass seven or eight years ago. In more recent years we bought what we thought was an open sugar in an antique mall. Both of these pieces have marigold iridescence. The large hobstar design on the sides of the pieces is in the shape of an eight-pointed wheel and certainly resembles a snow flake. The design is repeated on the under base in a six-pointed hobstar.

Marion Hartung sketched the Snow Fancy pattern in her Seventh Book of Carnival Glass first published in 1966. She suggested that this pattern resembled other Near-cut patterns produced by the Mckee Glass Company, but was unsure of the maker. Since then, Carl O. Burns, in his book Imperial Carnival Glass, pointed out that the pattern was pictured in Butler Brothers Wholesale Catalog in an assortment with known Imperial designs. What we purchased as an open sugar is now known to be the spooner in a four piece table set. Neither a covered sugar nor a butter dish have yet been reported in carnival glass. The only color reported for the creamer and spooner is marigold.

Carl Burns noted that the only other carnival shapes reported are small bowls in marigold, white, purple, and helios.

We find it interesting that in spite of the rarity of this pattern, collector interest seems low. The only sales listed in the Mordini Auction Price Reports were a marigold creamer and sugar (spooner) for \$100 in 1989 and a purple small bowl for \$40 in 1990. Perhaps this is due to the limited number of shapes in the pattern. At any rate, the two pieces that we have from the table set are attractive and fun to have and are certainly appropriate to the season.



MOTEL — Embassy Suites Hotel, 7640 N.W. Tiffany Springs Parkway, Kansas City, Missouri (At the Kansas City International Airport). Reservations can be made by calling the Hotel directly at 816-891-7788, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. & 7:00 P.M. on weekdays. Ask to speak to Jamie in Reservations, and mention the HOACGA convention. Other times, reservations can be made by calling 1-800-EMBASSY (1-800-362-2779). The FAX No. at the hotel is 816-891-7513.. If you will need a table(s), (6 ft) for your display or for selling glass, please request it when making your reservations. The table rental charge is \$15.00 per table, for the duration of the convention. Shuttle service is available from the Airport, call the Embassy Suites. EACH SUITE HAS A WINDOW FOR DISPLAYING YOUR GLASS.

ROOM RATES — The rate for all suites, except suites 219 thru 226, is \$98.00 per day for single or double occupancy. For three or four occupancy, the rate is \$108.00 per day. The visit to Key West was most enjoyable where the temperature got to 80 degrees, much better than the 20 degrees in Kansas City.

The convention was at a Holiday Inn Motel. The Officers and those helping with the convention had every thing well organized, which always makes it pleasant for everyone. The only thing they did not have under control was the Amtrak passenger train that made good use of the railroad tracks next to the Motel. Some members did not like to hear the train's whistle at all hours of the day and night. I thought it was rather nice to hear a train whistle for a change, here in the Mid-West we do not hear many train whistles, even though Kansas City is the second largest rail hub in the U.S.

We did not get to Ft. Lauderdale in time to tour the home John Valentine and Joe Alves, and see their collection of Contemporary Carnival Glass. Those that toured their home said they did not know that much Contemporary Glass was made. Some of the members were commenting about the age of some of this glass; it is now 25 years old. Many collectors can remember when the glass was starting to be produced and all of the controversy that it created .

Randy and Jackie Poucher always had the Hospitality open and very well stocked with anything a person could want. In addition, there was always some good conversation going.

Dee Bekemeier presented a very informative educational program on "Red" Carnival Glass, of course with her "Red Hat". Dee & Paul have one of the larger collections of "Red" Carnival. They had an "Open House" on Monday after the convention for any one that wanted to come by. Those that were able to stop by enjoyed seeing all of the Red along with many, many pieces of other colors also.

Stephen and Glen Thistlewood gave an outstanding talk after the Banquet on Saturday evening. They have recently authored another book "A Century of Carnival Glass" which identifies many of the Non-U.S. patterns. Their talk reviewed the results of their extensive research of the many European Glass

Factories. It was very interesting and informative. As a result of their research the Non-U.S. patterns has opened a whole new avenue for collectors.

The Burns Auction Service had some very nice glass with many of the pieces considered unusual and rare. Much of the glass was different than most present day auctions. There were twenty-seven (27) Water Sets, thirty-three (33) Pitchers, fifty-three (53) tumblers and three (3) milk pitchers. Some of the pieces and prices realized were:

Cosmos and Cane

Pattern Series

Heart of America Carnival Glass Association

Cosmos and Cane was produced by the US Glass Company, a conglomerate of several glass plants in the eastern United States. While US Glass made a number of patterns in carnival glass, only Cosmos and Cane and Palm Beach were produced in any quantity.

The predominant colors for Cosmos and Cane are honey amber and white with a few pieces in marigold and a very rare amethyst. Honey amber is unique to the US Glass Company and is an excellent description of the color—a warm yellowish iridescence on clear glass. White pieces are usually very frosty and have good iridescence. Cosmos and Cane pieces have been reported in crystal. A large portion of the US Glass Company's output was crystal glass.

Cosmos and Cane was used on water sets, table sets, breakfast sets, berry bowls, bowls, compotes, rosebowls, and many whimsies—a total of 17 shapes. More whimsey shapes are known in Cosmos and Cane than almost any other pattern.

Plates. Only two of the 10½" chop plates (at right) are known, both in honey amber. Curiously, they glow under a black light.

Headdress interior. Many bowls in the pattern are found with an elaborate pattern on the inside called Headdress, shown on an amethyst ruffled bowl, below.

A rare platter. Possibly made from a butter dish bottom, this oval whimsey is the only one known.

The shaped bowl. This is a fairly common shape, invariably seen with the Headdress interior and almost always in white. Tricorner versions of this same bowl are also seen.

Ladies spittoon. There are two known of these delicate white spittoons. They are less than 3½ inches across.





Rosebowls. The typical shape of cupped-in bowl (below) is known in at least two sizes, although auction listings sometimes refer to the dome-footed compotes as rosebowls. Shown here are a large honey amber rosebowl made from a master berry bowl and a marigold example made from a small bowl with the Headdress interior.





Compotes. There is a wide variety of compotes found in the Cosmos and Cane pattern, all of them quite rare. The three above were all made from the same mold, but whimsied into these special shapes: a spittoon shape, a tulip shape, and one that collectors call "volcano." The stemmed compote, sometimes referred to as a jelly compote, is very rare and known in honey amber and white.







Table sets. These come in both honey amber and white, with a few pieces known in marigold and lavender. Honey amber is the more difficult color to find. **Breakfast sets.** This set, which consists of an open sugar and creamer that are smaller than similar pieces in the table set, are found in white and a rare marigold.



Tumblers and pitchers.

Water sets were made in honey amber and white. White pieces are much more scarce, but neither is easily found. A few lavender and marigold tumblers are known. Some honey amber tumblers have "J.R. Milner Co. Lynchburg, VA" molded into the bottom and are very rare. A complete seven-piece water set in either color would be about as expensive as any carnival water set.

Bowls. Bowls, like many shapes in Cosmos and Cane, are quite scarce. At the right is a ruffled bowl in white. Master berry bowls with or without the Headdress interior can be found in honey amber or white. Six-inch bowls are known in white and honey amber, with and without the Headdress interior. An oval, non-collar based bowl is known that may be a whimsey from a butter dish base.


