## **Inverted Feather Cracker Jar**

Maybe we should label this article as "the one that got away." This pretty Cambridge cracker jar was bought on the Internet but the seller failed to package it sufficiently and it arrived in a slightly shattered condition. So the world was deprived of another piece of history and beauty in the form of carnival glass. That broken glass was just the start of two months of aggravation and frustration dealing with the post office. I guess this article is to alert you as to what



problems you can encounter when dealing on eBay.

Sellers usually state that they have no responsibility for breakage if you do not insure the item. But what they don't tell you is that they also have little to lose when it is insured at your expense and broken in shipment because of their poor packaging. They should take responsibility for packing the item so it has the chance of arriving in one piece. The problem of the broken glass is dumped squarely in your lap. You are the one who has to return it to the post office, file a claim and wait for the post office to validate your claim and refund your money. And in this case the time span was over two months. We have been told that two months was pretty fast service. OUCH! The seller has your money and what you get is some sympathy, if you are lucky, and a run around from the post office. Your local post office will tell you that they have handled their part and give you a phone number to a postal claim office that gets you nowhere. No voice contact with real people, you just punch in a number and listen to canned message responses.

You can walk into any post office, request insurance on a package with no questions asked of what is in the box or how well it is prepared for shipment. They must collect many thousands of dollars each day doing this and don't hesitate a moment. But that entire nonchalant attitude is lost when you file your claim. The claim form itself, after you fill it out, travels back and forth between your post office and the seller to validate the claim, then you wait and wait. The seller should be the insured, not the buyer, and refund your payment then. And only then would they take a little more effort in how the glass is packed.

Green Cambridge Inverted Feather cracker jars are the predominant color and are not that hard to find. The problem is finding one that has great iridescence. This one met that criteria but didn't survive the trip.

#### **EXCHANGE BANK**

Glendive, MT

This particular bank was founded in 1901, in the 100 block of Merrill Avenue in Glendive, MT. Not until 1911 did the bank become chartered. Prior to 1900, most banks were privately owned and totally



unregulated. The bank survives today as First Security Bank; although not in the original building. Probably a good thing, because pictures of the original building's interior show one teller's window, with no creature comforts of any kind!

The back pattern on this piece offers the Wide Panel; a standard for many of the pieces manufactured by Fenton.

This Advertising design is available in the usual amethyst color, with known shapes being: ruffled and IC shaped bowls, handgrip and flat plates...all considered to be RARE.

Since we are discussing the flat plate shape, prices since 1999 have ranged from \$1,500 to as much as \$3250 at various auctions around the Country. Iridescence and damage factors, along with the number of determined buyers present, determine the outcome of any purchase, of course. Until the research efforts of John Resnik resulted in the publishing of his Book on the subject in 1989, many of these pieces were not given the credit they so well-deserve!

We had never been in the right place at the right time to purchase this plate, so you may imagine our complete surprise when in opening the HOACGA Bulletin one day during 2001, one was listed for sale. Further surprised to find in calling the seller, that it could be sent on approval, we quickly agreed to such thoughtfulness! It is exactly what we were looking for, and could not be more pleased had we sat for hours waiting for the piece to come up for bid at an auction!

## **HEADDRESS Imitation is Flattery**

The Tenth in a Series on Non USA Carnival

Plagiarism - it's just a fancy word for "copying" - but it sounds a little better. Many of the Carnival Glass manufacturers did it at some time or another (just think of all those Peacock patterns). If a design is popular, why not produce your own version of it? Quite a few of the USA Classic Carnival patterns were also copied by the European Carnival Glass makers. Sowerby's blatant theft of Imperial's Scroll Embossed pattern is well reported (though it probably confused some of the early collectors). Another pattern that was copied was Headdress. The interesting article in the August 2002 HOACGA Bulletin by Alan & Lorraine Pickup sets the scene well.


The United States Glass Company made examples of Carnival Glass featuring the Headdress pattern, partnered with some Cosmos and Cane items. Now, just to confuse, there are several other patterns that are also found partnered with Headdress. These are: Curved Star, European Poppy and Nutmeg Grater. It is our belief that these were all made by Brockwitz of Germany (our original research on these patterns can be seen in Network #17, 1998; for further evidence on Nutmeg Grater, see "A Century of Carnival Glass"). Brockwitz simply copied the Headdress pattern.

To further complicate the situation, there are slight variations in Headdress, but the basic concept is the same. The illustrations show some of these minor variations. We can state with reasonable certainty that Curved Star and Nutmeg Grater were both Brockwitz patterns as they appear in their catalogs. European Poppy is almost certainly Brockwitz too - the evidence is circumstantial but very strong.


Headdress continued...

The Curved Star pattern itself is often the source of confusion, because several makers produced it, but the answer to that conundrum is simple (see our third article in this HOACGA series "The Mysterious Curved Star"). Virtually all the Carnival examples of Curved Star that are found are from Brockwitz. Very, very occasionally an Eda or Karhula-littala example will show up. Check out the claws in the pattern for verification: Brockwitz Curved Star pieces have a file pattern on the claws.


So, if you come across an item with Curved Star on the outside and Headdress on the inside - it will be Brockwitz. If, on the other hand, the Headdress pattern is partnered with Cosmos and Cane - it's a United States Glass piece. Mystery solved.



A detail of the Headdress plume as seen on Curved Star repeated 4 times around the central motif.




Detail from Headdress with Cosmos & Cane

## **September 2002 Meeting of HOACGA**

The August 25 meeting was attended by the regulars and Don Lacock brought some friends from Topeka, Ray and Pam Moore. Cliff and Jo Ann Ball had a schedule conflict. but Cliff brought by the Treasurer's Report showing an ending balance of 17,134.38. Other business meeting items were upcoming auctions and conventions (see the back of this bulletin), the announcement of Tommy Whitley as the 2003 banquet speaker, and mention of an upcoming meeting at the convention hotel to discuss a fixed price for the next two year's conventions. After a break for Krispy Kreme donuts furnished by Daryl and Norma Strohm, we discussed the Amethyst glass we brought for August. Members shared the particulars for the glass each had brought. It is always interesting to hear how people obtained their glass and the unusual stories about it. You can always learn something. The meetings are very enjoyable, which brings me to an important part of the business meeting I saved for last. We discussed the monthly meetings and low attendance. It was suggested we try something different, so in September we will vote on decreasing the frequency and/or changing the location to member homes or alternating member homes with the PV Community Center.

PLEASE attend the September meeting or make your wishes known to the Board of Directors. Ray Moore won the door prize, a beautiful paperweight in emerald green with the Fenton initial engraved on it in white.

#### HEART OF AMERICA CARNIVAL GLASS ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING - AUGUST 22, 2002

The HOACGA Board held their monthly meeting in Lawrence, Kansas on August 22, 2002. Present were President Grissom, Vice President Lacock, Treasurer Ball, Secretary McMorris and Editor Mochel. Lawrence is a central location for the five board members as they all live within a 40-60 mile radius.

The September newsletter contents were discussed. More articles from members are needed for the September and future bulletins. Order information and forms for materials offered by the club will continue to be included in the bulletin. Eleanor reported more problems for the printer with the post office requirements on bulk mail sorting. Several members have indicated either late delivery or none for the August bulletin, but hopefully these problems are being corrected.

Treasurer Cliff Ball reported that all bills are paid and the club has \$17,444.00 in the account.

President Grissom reported on the inventory of books, video tapes and glass items stored at various members' homes and the Board discussed possible means of selling the books and glass.

The 2003 Convention planning continued. The raffle of \$1,000 cash will be held. Bob is working on the second section of Candlesticks for the notebook and adding information on spittoons. The various programs – Britt Award nominee, educational seminars, display, banquet speaker – are being finalized. The auction contracts are being prepared. Fenton Glass Company will be working with Bob on the glass items for the convention.

Bob attended the Texas Convention and took two boxes of Britt materials to Eleanor Blair for a project she is working on to put out a disc with pictures of all carnival glass patterns. The materials were articles and photographs. There are many old club newsletters in the Britt boxes and these will be offered at the silent auction in 2003. Ed Kramer and Bob have spent much

time coordinating the Britt materials in order to use them to good advantage. This has been an ongoing project.

The Embassy Suites of Kansas City will be contacted for room rates for the 2004 and 2005 conventions.

The board discussed whether it would be advantageous to change the monthly meeting to either every other month or quarterly and possibly to hold it in members' homes or other locations in conjunction with an event such as a carnival glass auction or an antique show. If held in members' homes this would provide an opportunity to view collections. Attendance at the monthly meetings is low and mostly the same group each month. This matter was tabled for further study.




