FENTON'S #400 VASE

Sherman Hand's 1978 book "The Collectors Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass" calls this vase a "Bud Vase Whimsey" (Sherman Hand's spelling) and comments: "The collector who likes the different and unusual things would surely enjoy this little bud vase. Just what the glass worker had in mind when he shaped this Whimsey, I really don't know, whatever it was I love it." Our first encounter with these vases was at the 23rd Annual International Carnival Glass convention at Elkhart, Indiana back in July of 1989.

This convention like most conventions had a variety of wonderful glass displays, but one display that left a lasting impression on us was Dr. Larry Keig's exhibit of Fenton #400 vases. These vases, although quite simple in design, have something of an elegant air about them. Larry's display with its assortment of shapes and colors was the trigger that motivated us to add some 19 of these vases to our glass collection today.

This vase is shown in two different shapes in a 1921 advertisement of Fenton Art Glass shown in William Heacock's book, "Fenton Glass, The First Twenty-Five Years". It is usually found in four shapes: ruffled, square, Jack in the Pulpit and two sides up. Some collectors refer to this vase as "not carnival glass" but stretch glass, and indeed there are some stretch glass versions. But after some 13 years of looking we have only been able to purchase three vases in stretch and interestingly all three are the Two Sides Up shape. The usual glass colors found are Grecian gold, Persian pearl, Celeste blue, Cobalt blue, Topaz, and Florentine green. But it is also known in red, although very rare, and last year a JIP marigold over aqua vase was sold at a Jim Seeck auction in Iowa for a hefty \$350. Some at the sale felt it was marigold over celeste blue. Either way, when you come right down to it, either marigold iridescence over aqua or over celeste blue, it is surely a very rare vase.

Fenton's #400 Vase continued...

The ruffled white JIP vase shown here was recently purchased by us on Ebay out of Arkansas with 12 bids from 8 different determined bidders, and this is the first vase we have seen in this ruffled jack in the pulpit shape. We would like to think of this vase as a "whimsy" Jack in the pulpit Bud Vase Whimsey.

These vases are pictured in Edwards/Carwile book under "Whimsy Pieces" and listed additionally in a wisteria glass base color. The wisteria vase has so far escaped us, but we will keep looking. Flash: We have just received by E-mail a message with pictures from another prominent lowa collector of what would best be described as a Sapphire blue vase in the two sides up shape. Does anybody else have additional colors that are not mentioned here?



FERN BRAND CHOCOLATES

This is one of the more available patterns among the 6" Advertising pieces, although a nice flat, colorful plate will usually command a price of \$1000. The only other shape is a handgrip style plate.

You'll notice that instead of the usual two Mums sprigs, this design has a very appropriate fern frond over top of the writing...the floral arrangement differs from all other Northwood Advertising pieces, as well.

Five examples of this piece are on record in auction results for 2001 - certainly not many when compared to some other patterns which sell in the dozens every year!


Ray and Verda Asbury of Burlington, IA; home of Fern Brands Chocolates performed research even before John Resnik. Their findings indicate that Gardner and Gould was the parent company. Established in June, 1900, at the corner of Elm and Third Streets, the company produced a wide range of confections, until their demise in July, 1955.

As with other pieces in this category, Northwood used their Basketweave pattern for the exterior.

If your interest extends to media products, you may want to be alert to

wooden and cardboard boxes bearing the Fern Brand Chocolates advertising. John Resnik mentions that he found some examples during his research.

This lovely plate has been in our collection since July of 1998, It was purchased from a long-time San Diego friend, Dennis Sutton. He found it in a La Jolla, CA mall.

Sowerby's Diving Dolphins

The Twelfth in a series on non USA Carnival By Glen and Stephen Thistlewood

In the ninth article we wrote in this series, we took a look at the beautiful Carnival Glass made by Sowerby in the north east of England. In this, our twelfth article, we're going back to the north east of England - to Tyneside - to look at that splendid pattern, "Diving Dolphins."

On many of their older pieces of glass, Sowerby used the peacock head trademark that we described in our previous article on the company. The photograph will show you what that trademark actually looks like impressed onto an example of crystal glass from the late 1800s. You can see the peacock head at the top and below it, the diamond registration lozenge. When it's found on Carnival, however, only the peacock head was used.

When Sowerby began to produce Carnival Glass in the early 1920s, they brought some of their old moulds into use. One of the most famous re-used moulds was the "Diving Dolphins". First produced back in the 1880s, Sowerby had already made this



splendid item in various colors and types of glass. On the older, non-Carnival items, their peacock head trademark can often be seen in the center of the plain interior. When they reissued "Diving Dolphins" in Carnival, they replaced the plain interior with a plagiarized version of Imperial's "Scroll Embossed" design, This led many early Carnival collectors back in the 1960s, to assume the "Diving Dolphins" was actually an Imperial item! In replacing the plain interior with the patterned one, they also removed the trademark, thus no Carnival examples are known bearing the peacocks head.

As you can see by the photograph, the "Diving Dolphins" bowls stand on three feet, each styled to form the shape of a dolphin's head. Their bodies curve up and round, onto the main part of the bowl. Around the sides of the bowl are stylized flowers and leaves, the combination of elements forming a most attractive, overall design. Note that this pattern is cameo (raised up off the surface of the glass). The three footed bowl shape was the only one made in the pattern but variations in finish are known. There are smoothly flared bowls, as well as rare square and tricorn bowls and rose bowls, all shaped from the same mould. The known colors are marigold, amethyst and rare aqua/teal blue shades. A deeper shade of amber-like marigold is also known.

Well another great auction to add to the list of many we have been fortunate enough to attend. It was the Great Lakes Carnival Glass Club "Glass Bash Auction".

This is a friendly club with lots of pretty room displays and a very nice hotel for their convention. The auction glass was very nice also. Some really nice Aqua Opal items if you like the pastels.

This auction was in November in Lansing Michigan at the Best Western Midway Hotel and the auction was conducted by the Burns Auction Service. Around 250 pieces were sold.

I am sending some photos that may be placed with the article so you can see a few of the nice items that were available that day.

The rare Whimsey Tornado Marigold Vase with an internal bruise sold to a New York Mailbidder for \$2250. The Millersburg Hobnail Blue pitcher with wonderful blue iridescence and a tiny chip on the spout brought \$4000. The Ice Green Opal Rose Show plate brought \$7500.

The Multi-Fruits and Flowers Pitcher brought \$16,000 (I think it was either \$16,000 or \$19,000 anyway needless to say it's not at our house) the matching tumbler brought \$1000. The Celeste Blue Orange Tree Bowl brought \$6000.

There were some of the nicest poppy show items you could of asked to see. The Marigold Poppy Show Plate (pumpkin, the best I have ever seen) sold for \$2800. The Blue Poppy Show plate sold for \$3000. The Green Poppy Show bowl with a tiny chip sold for \$2400.

An Aqua Opal Peacocks bowl (the best I have seen) sold for \$1900. An AO Good Luck Bowl sold for \$2850. An AO Grape and Cable PCE Bowl sold for \$2500. AO Three Fruits Plates one sold for \$7500 and the other for \$5500. An AO Fenton Vintage sold for \$1200.

One of my favorite items was the Smoke Chrysanthemum Chop Plate with stretch iridescence, really neat and sold for \$2500. The Farmyard nicely ruffled and laid out so you could see the pattern really good but had epoxy so sold for only \$1800.

Marigold over Moonstone Orange Tree bowl was a knockout with the caramel colored iridescence a real pretty piece that sold for \$1000 and an Electric Blue Peacocks PCE bowl sold for \$1500.








Request for Information Dugan/Diamond Beaded Baskets

I am researching the Dugan and Diamond Beaded Baskets, attempting to learn which colors were produced in which of two handle configurations and in which of two top shapes. I ask that those of you who own one or more of these baskets to let me know what you have. I would appreciate your time and effort in clipping, photocopying, or copying and pasting the form below, completing it, and then either sending or e-mailing it to me. Or simply tell me what you have if you don't want to bother filling out the form.

Some of the Beaded Baskets were produced with straight-up handles and others with flared-out handles. Some were made with round tops and others with oblong tops (top of basket dimensions, not from edge to edge of the two handles. I know that these baskets come in the following colors or have been reported in those colors. They may also come in colors of which I am unaware. (For example, my marigold basket has the straight-up handles, and it has the oblong top, measuring just over 4 inches across from edge to edge underneath the handles and about 5 inches the other way. So if I were completing the form below, I'd write "oblong" in the space across from "marigold" and below "straight-up handles.")

I am not certain if the basket was made in purple as well as in amethyst and oxblood (black amethyst) or in aqua as well as sapphire. I have never seen one in what I consider a true purple. I've seen the aqua listed in auction reports and in on-line auctions. In fact, I bought one once through an absentee bid, but it turned out to be sapphire. Thus, I don't actually know if a true aqua – a light blue with a slight hint of green – base color – as opposed to an aqua iridescence – exists. The sapphire has a brilliant blue, though not a cobalt, base color, identified by looking through the side at the narrowest portion near its base.

2002 HOACGA NOTEBOOK INSERT Candlesticks – 1st Section

You may not have many candlesticks in your collections, but what is your knowledge of the ones you have? Do you know the difference between a Northwood "Colonial." a Fenton "Florentine," or a Vineland "Colonial?"

The HOACGA Notebook section for 2002 will be the first of two sections identifying Candlesticks. Several collectors have candlesticks in their collection, but this is an area of Carnival glass collecting where information is not readily found. This section of the notebook is an attempt to compile them in one place, present as much information as possible, and to show them with a color photograph. Most of these are described in other publications, but you will need several reference books to be able to find them.

Much time has been spent, not only by me, but several other collectors, trying to identify the various pieces. Information such as this is only possible with the help of many members who have supplied photographs and a listing of their candlesticks.

CORRESPONDENCE

My wife, Viola, and I were particularly attracted to the article in the November issue of the HOACGA Bulletin entitled "Imperial's Cape Cod" by Alan and Lorraine Pickup.

One day in 1999, we were in attendance at a small estate auction sale in Perry, IA. They had one of these Cape Cod cruets which we were able to purchase for \$25. Though we have been avid carnival glass collectors for some 40 years, we had never seen one before.

Our cruet is exactly like the one pictured in the bulletin article and is 5" tall including the stopper. It has an unusually attractive marigold iridescence. The neck and the stopper have been ground to fit perfectly. The end of the stopper is also ground so as to leave a very narrow edge that is iridized, thus proving that the grinding was done after the piece was iridized. I have carefully examined the bottom of the cruet and I find no label of any kind inscribed upon it.

I wish that we could offer more enlightening information about this piece. but we have always been puzzled by it. The only reference we can find to it in our library is on Page 24 of David Doty's book and that is not very informative.




