SINGING BIRDS MUGS

The Northwood Singing Birds pattern is a very popular one and a favorite among mug collectors. Singing Birds can also be found in table sets, water sets, berry sets and a small sherbet type dish. But if you would like to collect a variety of colors in a given shape or



pattern, then the Singing Bird mugs will certainly satisfy this challenge. Dave Doty's book "A Field Guide to Carnival Glass" list some 13 different known carnival glass colors. Carl Burn's, "Northwood Carnival Glass" lists 14 colors? And today with EBay shrinking the world, as we know it, the possibility exists that other colors may surface.

The design has eight panels. Two panels featuring two different birds, with two panels of flowers and berries repeated twice around the mug. The carnival mugs also can be found with a stippled variation as well as the non-stippled mugs. The stippled mugs are listed in five carnival glass colors, and with the exception of the color marigold, are seldom seen. We would suppose that the stippled Renninger Blue mug is the rarest? Pictured here is our aqua opal mug, none known in the stippled version, and a nice stippled electric blue mug that was purchased on Ebay.

Non-iridescent mugs can be found in blue, rare vaseline, and white opal, also custard glass mugs with nutmeg stain and a green mug referred to as "coke bottle" green. We have handled several of these "coke bottle" mugs that are quite crude. Did the Northwood Company or someone else with the mould make these?

Another additional benefit that can be derived from a collection of these beautiful mugs, besides the splash of colors that they present, is that they don't take up a whole lot of precious space. And if you are a serious glass collector you get to a point where space is sometimes as important as cost. Okay, we are only kidding, if the price is right you always will manage to find space. Happy hunting.

According to John Resnik's research in 1989, the who, what, where, and when aspects of these Advertising pieces proved to be an "invigorating challenge." Mostly these circumstances were historically available only in their broadest terms. However, in the case of this Shoe Store, the exact date of its debut was discovered. The Central Shoe Store opened its doors for business on Saturday, November 21, 1908. Announcement of the opening was stated on the prior day, in the East St. Louis Journal, stating that souvenirs would be given to all who attended the opening! Apparently, business was not good for Messrs C.W. and J.H. Byerly of Quincy, IL. Their business listing was discontinued after 1911.

This design was manufactured by Fenton with the Wide Panel exterior. It can be found in ruffled and ice cream shaped bowls, as well as handgrip and flat plates. All should be considered quite scarce. Few of these ever reach public auction.

Our little handgrip gem was secured in November, 1983 when we visited Christ and Ethel Harnish over in PA. This was when they still lived in the big house with all that wonderful and exciting china collection. Once we had drooled long enough over that, we were taken upstairs to see Carnival Glass! Now, Christ had what he called the "No-No" Cabinet with articles of choice treasure which were not for sale - only for display. Would you believe that we convinced him to part with this plate? However, he and Ethel held a private "conference" to decide upon an appropriate parting price. We decided that we could meet their challenge and have thoroughly enjoyed having the plate in our growing collection. By today's standards for this piece, we very likely owe them money.

Since everyone knows that a Peter Rabbit plate, a Concord plate, Wildrose Lamps, etc. are rare, we are going to mention three pieces that some people might not notice but are actually very unusual and hard to find. All three pieces pictured are blue.

The first piece is a blue Stork & Rushes mug. There are only a few known and this one is special because it has super iridescence. The middle piece is a blue ribbed Tornado vase. This is an extremely rare piece in blue plus it is very nice. Many people collect Tornado vases but do not have a blue one - here's your chance! The last piece is a flute toothpick. This is a fairly common piece but not in blue. There are not many around and rarely come up for auction.

Can you imagine walking into Carnival Glass Heaven with more rare, beautiful, sparkling glass than your mind could really comprehend? This was the feeling when walking into the Blue Glass Convention Center in Louisville, Kentucky in March of 1977 at the largest carnival glass auction ever held - up to now. It was like a collector's dream come true. This was the Wishard Spectacular.

There were some 300 water sets, 80 punch sets, plates, table sets, berry sets, bowls, rarities, lamps, and on and on and on. There were 1,214 numbered lots with many unnumbered lots. Some of those were trays of mugs, tumblers, misc. pieces and large tables on wheels they would also roll in and sell each tray or table full as one lot.

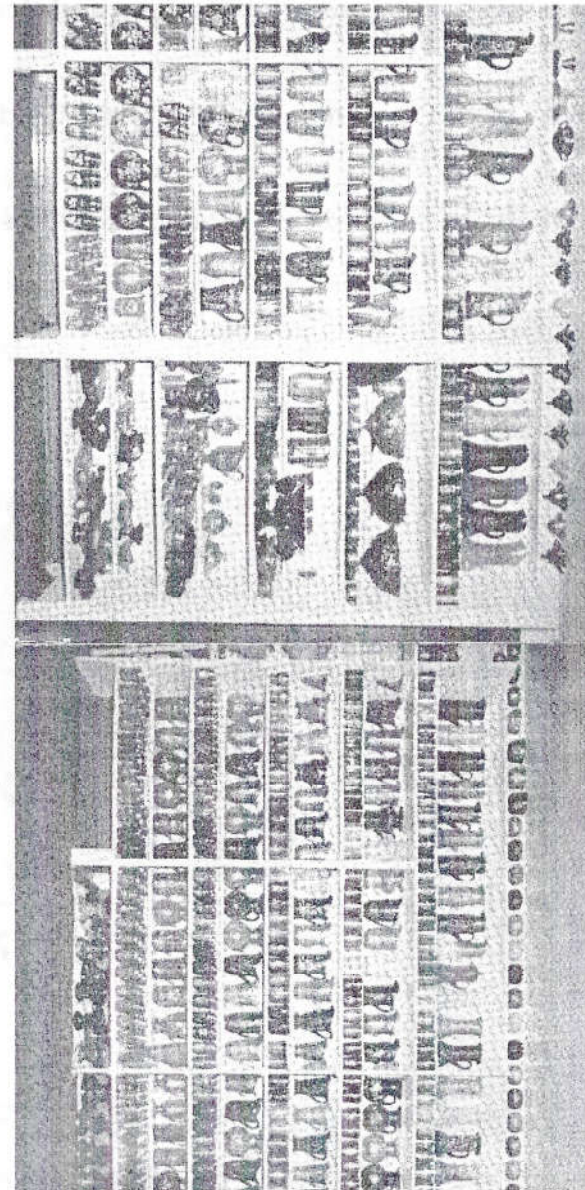
An amethyst Millersburg Peoples Vase sold for \$5,900 and one has now sold privately for \$45,000. An outstanding emerald green (which was just known then as green) rose show plate sold for \$400 and in later years sold for \$7,000. It was the prettiest emerald green rose show I have ever seen.

Besides all of the excellent glass, making new friends (I first met Floyd Whitley at breakfast there) and attending a non-stop auction that lasted for hours and hours, there was one other happening that those in attendance will probably still remember... After John Woody had sold a Chatelaine tumbler, several times, and it was returned each time for damage, he suddenly just threw the tumbler over his shoulder with it crashing on the floor with the crowd in awe. Needless to say, the crowd became more alert and starting paying more close attention to the auctioneer again.

Eleanor and I wouldn't give anything for our memories of this most outstanding auction.

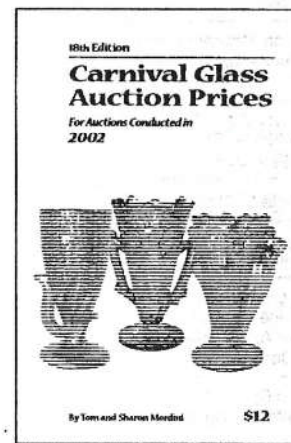
