## Imperial's File

As a primary pattern File was Imperial's No.256 and a large variety of shapes in crystal glass are pictured in Margaret and Douglas Archer's Imperial Glass catalog book. Only a limited amount of items are found in iridescent carnival glass. Table sets and water sets seem to be the most prolific shapes. Although shapes such as a rare marigold chop plate

and the marigold whimsy vase made from the table set sugar bottom are known. Dave Doty's book lists a purple seven and one half-inch bowl as having been sold in 1996. The Edwards/Carwile book lists several shapes in both marigold and amethyst that we are not familiar with.

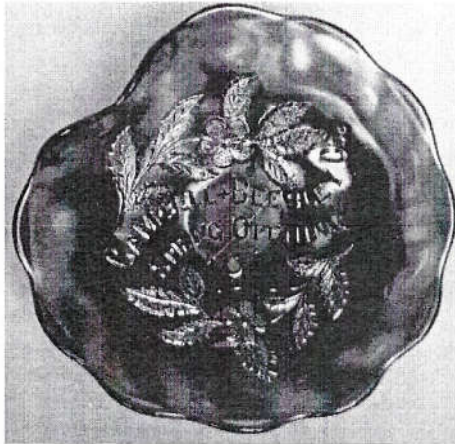
As a secondary pattern it is featured on Scroll Embossed bowls in purple, helios, smoke and clambroth. We have examples in Imperial's super purple iridescence and have seen a few small marigold bowls. The other colors have been somewhat elusive for us.

Now the reason for this abbreviated story. Recently Rick Graham, a well-known Kentucky collector of many things, discovered what we consider a neat find in a Bowling Green, Kentucky antique mall. He found a very nice marigold File tumbler with provenance. Inscribed on the upper area of the tumbler is the name "**Christina Kimble Aug. 12, 1909.**" Was this tumbler a birthday remembrance or a souvenir from a carnival visit? We know that someone treasured it for these many years and it held a special meaning to Christina. Finding glass that has people's names or places inscribed, just like advertising pieces lends a personal and meaningful connection with the past.

Nice find Rick, now see if you can find the pitcher!

# CAMPBELL & BEESLEY CO. SPRING OPENING - 1911

Attribution again escapes us! We do know this business existed in 1911, with SPRING OPENING indicating that it may have been a retail outlet. Beyond that, as Mr. Resnik states: "we proceed on sheer speculation!"

By virtue of the smooth, unserrated edge and the typical Millersburg many rayed star, as found on the Two-eyed Elk pieces, we

make our second assumption. (We all know what they say about assumption, so we'll not elaborate on that one!)

This item, known only in the handgrip style of plate, can be found with the bent portion provided at just about every position on the "clock." It very likely is the greatest example of random glass shaping found on any of the lettered pieces.

These can be said to "escape us" with regularity, which is to say they are very scarce. Only one example sold at auction in 2001, it seems.

Our beautiful example was purchased in 1987 from Chuck and Peggy Bullard of Northern, CA...it was that year, when we decided to walk along this path of accumulation. The challenge has been stymieing at times, but overall rewarding. Such effort is NOT for the faint of heart, nor the short-term collector. There is no resemblance to "lining up all your Peacock colors in a row...in short order!"

# "STIPPLED ESTATE" by Dugan

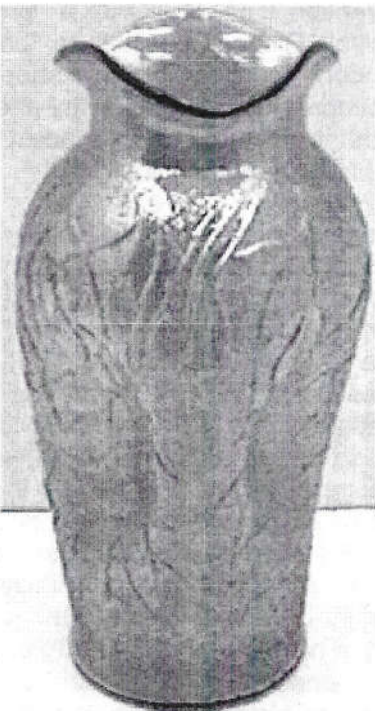
Convention time at HOACGA provides great opportunities for the Carnival Glass Collector to become saturated with iridescent splendor. One can window shop, visit with like-minded collectors, learn more about the hobby by attending seminars, and buy beautiful pieces of glass to enhance one's collection. We all have stories to tell... here is one of mine.

After setting up our room display at the 2002 convention, we were anxious to make contact with carnival collectors. In late evening, my husband suggested we find some open rooms to visit, so I gulped down the last of my peach tea Snapple and gave the tea stained bottle to him to throw away. We headed down the hall and found James Bond's (Wayne Anderson's) room open with other collectors already visiting. JB and Maria love to host social gatherings, and they do it well. His 'sale' table was already set up. I saw an aqua (what else?) vase and zeroed in on it. It was a "Stippled Estate" vase by Dugan with a light overlay of marigold iridescence. I liked it and JB gave me a deal I couldn't refuse. I gave him the money and hugged my vase. Then, Cecil saw me across the room and asked if I bought it. I said, "Yes!" He looked at it again (with recent events fresh in his mind), and turned to JB, "You charged her how much for that Snapple bottle?" JB didn't know Cecil very well at that time, but it only took him a minute to give him a response. But, then, Maria heard and saw what the interchange was all about. She turned to JB and asked, "Did you sell that vase? I wanted to keep it." Money had already changed hands, so he stuck by the deal. I guessed I was the only one that was going to be happy. That's OK. I got my vase. LOL Actually, everybody accepted the transaction and we have continued to have a good laugh over it, but Cecil still calls it my "Snapple Bottle."

"Stippled Estate" by Dugan is often confused with "Estate" (without stippling) by Westmoreland. There is a similarity in the patterns in that they both have random raised outlining that reminds me of leaded glass. "Soda Gold" by Imperial is similar, but also has no stippling inside the random shapes. "Stippled Estate" was made only in vases, but the other similar patterns were made in many more shapes.

"STIPPLED ESTATE" by Dugan continued...

There is varying information about this pattern in the resource books available. "*The Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass, 8<sup>th</sup> Edition*" by Edwards/Carwile deals with the origin of the pattern mold. It appears the mold was acquired by the Dugan Glass Co. prior to carnival production from the Model Flint Glass Co. in Albany, Indiana. This resource only lists a 'bud vase' in marigold, peach opal, and ice green.



Carl O. Burns concurs in his book, "*Dugan & Diamond Carnival Glass*", and that this mold was used for their early carnival production until they created "more suitable patterns" later. This may account for the small numbers that are found. Mr. Burns allows that because they were mold blown, there could be great variations in shape, but lists only 3"-4" vases in peach opalescent, marigold, and green. The aqua vase pictured here is 6 1/2" tall, the body is 'pinched' on three sides, and has a tri-corner ruffled top.

The question of colors has to be raised since my aqua vase was not listed in the above sources. So, let's go to Dave Doty's "*A Field Guide to Carnival Glass*" and quote that information. "In 1998, Mickey Reichel auctioned ["Stippled Estate"] vases in amethyst for \$225, aqua for \$325, marigold for \$175, and vaseline for \$300." I guess we should all be on the lookout for other colors. Please let us know if you have a color not included here.

## THE STORY OF THE ICE BLUE STRAWBERRY PLATE

We were about as surprised as anyone in getting such a beautiful and rare piece of Carnival Glass. We have never spent anywhere near this much for a piece of glass. In fact, we paid less for our first home than we did for this plate.

The plate belonged to a young couple in Michigan. He inherited it along with numerous other antiques from his Grandmother. They are still unpacking her attic, garage and basement. Evidently she was quite an antique collector. They were not familiar or even knew that she had the plate and could not relate any information as to when or where she purchased it. They had no idea of its value but since they have sold other items on eBay they offered it for sale starting at \$5.00.

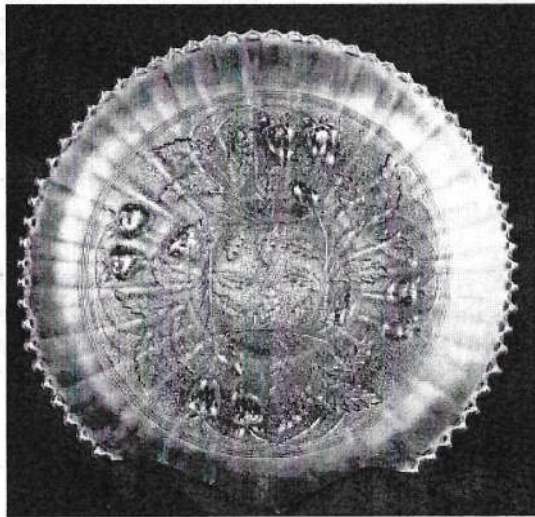
They soon received an email from someone offering them \$1000 if they would take it off eBay and sell to him. They decided to let it go to the highest bidder. They soon got another email from him raising his offer to \$3000, explaining that he realized it was a plate rather than a bowl. That didn't go over either. Others advised them to take it off eBay and let Christie's sell it for them. They still felt they should honor their original listing on eBay (even though, by then, they realized the plate must be something special). In fact, once the bidding reached several thousand, they immediately put the plate in a safe deposit box at the bank.

Our final bid was \$16,666.66 and were flabbergasted when we got the winning bid for a little less. A few minutes passed and we got an email from a fellow HOACGA member saying he tried to get his bid of \$18,500 in but the clock ran out.

The sellers wanted to fly to Arkansas and hand-deliver the plate to us. We were absolutely amazed but appreciated the special service. The man drove three hours to Flint and caught a plane to Cincinnati with connections to Little Rock, due to arrive here at 7:30 PM. We were at the Little Rock Airport at the baggage area looking for a clean-haven guy, dark hair, no glasses with a black briefcase. The plane came in but he wasn't on it. After looking in the restrooms, restaurant, bar and all other nooks & crannies (not too many places to get lost at our airport), we called his wife on our cell phone. She had not heard from him and didn't know anymore than we did. Another flight was due in from Cincinnati at 9:15 so we waited. He was on that one. Hooray! His flight from Flint did not make it to Cincinnati in time to connect with the earlier flight. And, he didn't bother to notify us or his wife of the missed connection. What a night! But just like the old farmer on the Blue Bell commercial - IT TURNED OUT GOOD!

The plate is absolutely perfect and gorgeous with hues of gold, pink, lavender and blue. We are very proud, elated and fortunate to have such a beautiful piece in our collection.

The HOACGA Board held their monthly meeting in Lawrence on June 12, 2003. All members were present. The monthly meeting will now be held on the second Thursday of each month instead of the third Thursday, thus allowing more time for Eleanor to put together the next month's bulletin.

Treasurer Ball reported a balance of \$14,741.91 with all bills paid.

The 2004 Convention planning continued. At the May meeting the Board members were asked to consider (1) what do we do for a special display (2) suggestions for the Britt Award honoree (3) Speakers for a program (4) banquet speaker (5) notebook section suggestion. Suggestions from the membership would be welcome. Contact any of the officers with your comments, suggestions, etc. The 2004 auction at the convention will be the collection of Jack Pritchard, auctioned by Jim Seeck.

Bob Grissom will contact Frank Fenton regarding a souvenir for 2004 and a room display item. Several suggestions were made and will be taken to Frank for consideration. Eleanor will be in charge of the banquet souvenir. After much consideration on the special display, it was decided to have a display of Imperial Pieces. Bob will start the process of getting this display together. Contacts are being made on speakers for the programs and banquet. Selection of a subject for the notebook section was considered. Bob will be researching on whether bowls would be a possible subject. No selection was made on the Britt Award but several members are being considered. The Board reviewed the criteria for selection of the person (s) to receive the Britt award.

## WE USE BROEKER'S FLOUR

Location for this business failed to be on record in the Minnesota State Library, although that State seemed a logical origin for such a thriving manufacturing concern. John Resnik inserted an update just prior to going to print with this Encyclopedia on the subject, saying he had accessed the National Demographics Study, revealing four locations as the most likely sites for this company. Upon delving more deeply into the subject, no definitive data was forthcoming from MN, NE, IA, or KS. (Should ANY of you readers have knowledge of such, we would most appreciate hearing from you!)

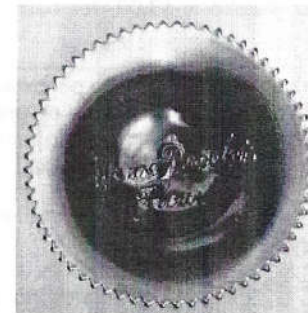
The maker is Northwood, and the back pattern is Basketweave.

Ten or twelve flat plate examples were known at the 1989 writing. We had purchased ours in July of 1987 from an individual. A very good illustration of the scarcity is indicated in the two auction sale prices listed for 2001. One having worn iridescence brought \$900. The other sold for \$1000. Circumstances indicate that should EITHER example be passed upon, perhaps YEARS ensue before another presents itself for inspection!

Progression of bidding for what appeared to be an extremely nice example of this rare plate offered for sale over Ebay was interesting to watch. Culmination of that competition was an \$1825 sale on February 23, 2003! That particular buyer has been systematically purchasing some very FINE ADVERTISING items over an extended period of time, we have observed. Heated desire always drives prices and a Broeker's plate certainly does NOT present itself in your monthly auction offerings with any regularity!

This may be a very good opportunity to say that in collecting these advertising items, tremendous variance exists in the overall quality of iridescence. Once the decision was made to collect them, we then would "pass" on some examples which did not appear with similar coloration to the ones already in hand, or those with surface scars and bruises. You can see that with determination such as this, YEARS pass without the privilege of adding a single new design to collection.

## HOACGA PATTERN NOTEBOOK

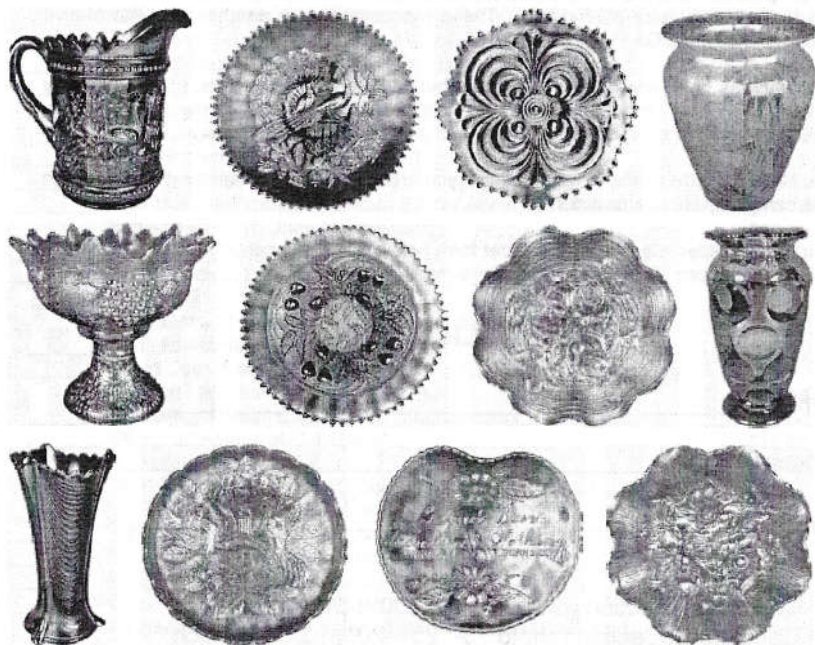

We thought the best-buy of the day (\$875) was a Green Good Luck plate with outstanding iridescence.

## LILY-OF-THE-VALLEY PITCHER & TUMBLERS

I recently received a telephone call from Loria in Golden City, Missouri. She had, sometime in the past, received a pitcher and 3 tumblers from her mother. Loria said she had always seen these pieces while visiting the family. Originally this was a complete water set (pitcher and 6 tumblers), but over the years three of the tumblers disappeared.

She has just recently started an Antique shop in Golden City and was going to put these pieces in the shop. Since she did not know anything about what she had, she started searching through books trying to identify her piece. While looking through "The Fenton First Twenty Five Years" book she recognized the pattern of her pitcher and tumblers as "Lily-of-the-Valley". She called the Fenton glass company to inquire about these pieces, and she was connected to Frank. He told her about the pieces and suggested she call me.

By the time she called me she knew the pattern, its scarcity, and had also found a price in another book on Fenton Glass, \$7,000.00 for the pitcher, and \$250.00 each for the tumblers. Of course the price guide did not say anything about the quality of iridescence. When I saw the pieces they were rather dirty and it was difficult to assess the pieces, except the pitcher has some damage. I believe the damage is caused from a bubble in the glass, some of the bubble has broken out to the outside. It is on the bulbous part towards the bottom. After a few days of considering the effect of the damage, I did purchase the four pieces.

One of the interesting things about this find, this is the third Lily-of-the-Valley pitcher that has been found in the same general area. Loria recalls this pitcher initially belonged to her Grandmother's Sister, who lived in Joplin, Missouri. Another pitcher that was found in this same general area was written about in the January 10, 1973, CARNIVAL GLASS NEWS & VIEWS published by O. Joe Olson. He wrote that on November 3, 1972, while attending the Hughes auction

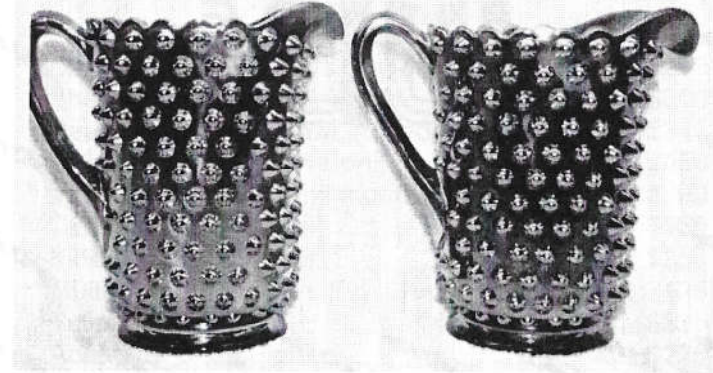

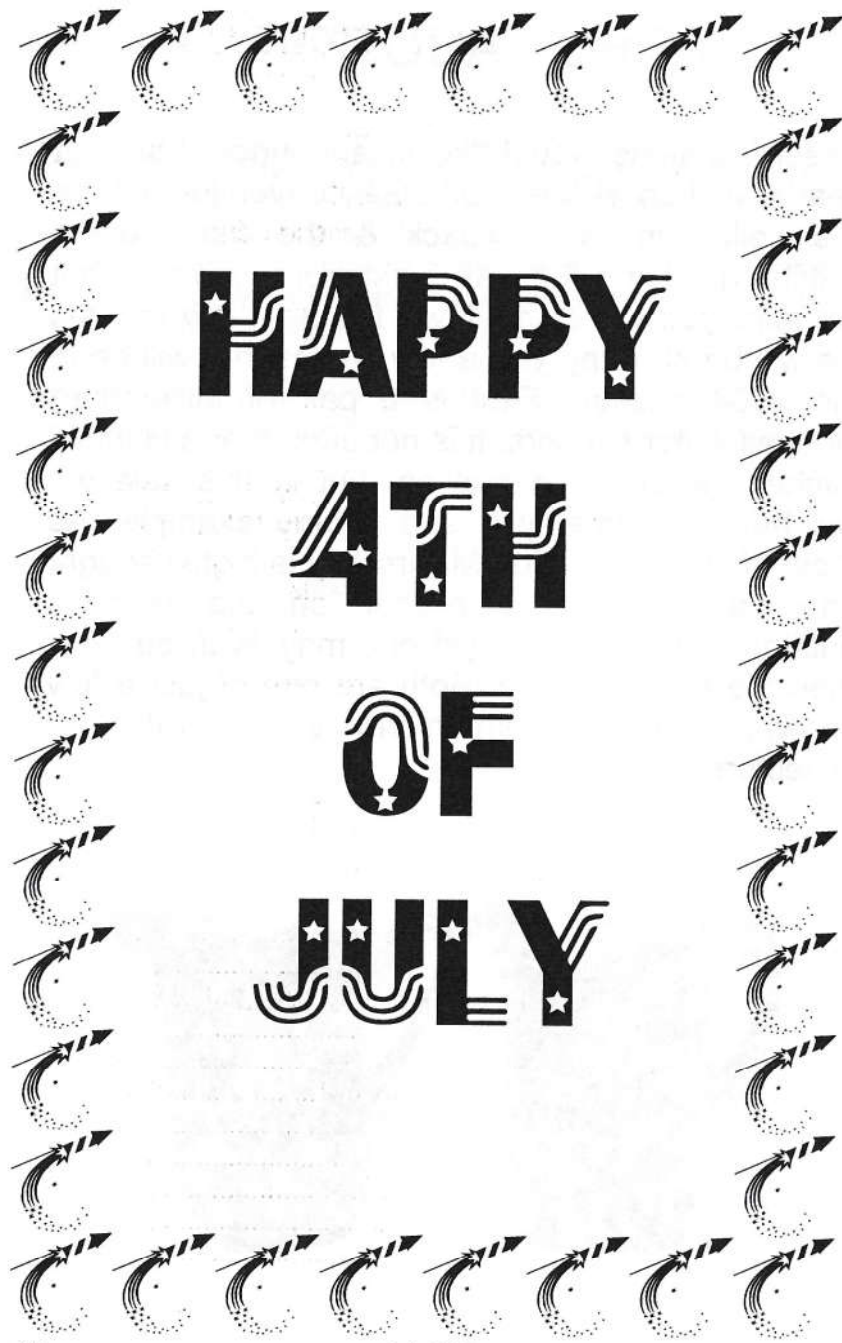
in St. Louis, Kenny & Helen James sold a "Lily-of-the-Valley" pitcher to Henry Taylor for \$4,500.00 (\$4,000.00 in cash and an Imperial "Nu-Art" plate). Kenny & Helen purchased this in the Southeastern part of Kansas for \$515.00, which was book price according to Marion Hartung's Price Guide. Charles & Eleanor Mochel have a pitcher also and it was purchased from a collector that lived in the Southeastern part of Kansas.

According to our numbers counter, Charles Mochel, there are now twelve known pitchers and five of these have damage.
