# **Orange Tree Fruit Bowls**



Orange Tree, a popular Fenton Glass pattern can be found in so many different shapes, colors, and varieties that just a collection of this one pattern could be a challenge in itself to assemble. Orange Tree fruit bowls, sometimes listed as orange bowls, are pretty common in Marigold and Blue. But green bowls are another story. But there have been several of them sold at auctions in the last few years and they usually cause some spirited bidding. Such as the bowl in Bob Stremming's 1998 auction in Ohio at \$1000 and another in a Mickey Reichel consignment sale in Missouri in January of 2000 for \$1800.

When a fruit bowl shape has been worked into a centerpiece shape the bidding really gets serious such as the bowl in the Garth Irby sale on January 13<sup>th</sup>, of 2001 conducted by the Woody Auction Company here in St. Louis. That bowl left here for \$6500 to its new home in North Carolina.

Can they be found in other colors? There was an amethyst fruit bowl that was sold by Jim Seeck in 1999 at an Illinois sale, listed as a rare color that only brought \$525. That seems to be a low price for such a rare color Orange Tree fruit bowl. Do other colors exist? Maybe, we could have missed one along the way and someone will surely let us know.

Those of us with the patience and good enough eye sight to wade thru hundreds of carnival glass listings on eBay each week have been rewarded many times in the last few years with sightings of glass patterns in colors that were not previously known to exist. Unfortunately, however, due to other priorities like eating, most of us can do nothing but L\$\$K. Does anyone else have that problem?



# GEVURTZ BROS FURNITURE & CLOTHING UNION AVE. & EAST BURNSIDE ST.

There is nothing to equal notoriety when extolling the virtues of collecting. There is a built-in feature within the soul of most humans, urging us to preserve that which went before. It is one of our more admirable traits. This in turn, conjures up the need to preserve the best of whatever lies within our interest. (All this flowery discussion brings attention to the fact that the plates in this particular design are nearly always "fabulously" iridized!)

We notice that one bowl and one plate sold at auction in 2001, with the plate realizing \$2100!...This is not at all surprising, for even if the collector of these lettered pieces has already satisfied the desire, anyone else would be drawn to admire the color portrayed.

The computer went into a frenzy over the spelling of Gevurtz, and Mr. Resnik says that during his research, seven different spellings were confronted in various auction brochures and reference books.

The **Gevurtz** company was established in the late 1800's, and after several locations, arrived at the corner of Union Ave. and East Burnside St. in downtown Portland, Oregon. This move occurred around 1902. 1919 brought them to the corner of Second St. and Morrison Ave. During the time spent at this location, several branches were opened in the surrounding area. The Gevurtz family still maintained the business at 6600 S.W. Bonita Rd, Tigard, Oregon when John Resnik created his Encyclopedia of Lettered Pieces in 1989. The move to that location had taken place sometime during the 1960's.

Fenton manufactured this design, and it has the Wide Panel exterior. Ruffled and IC shape bowls, along with the plates are scarce, with the H/G considered to be very scarce.

Our lovely plate example was purchased from Fred Roque in Nov. of 1992, while we were still living in San Diego. He has said he regrets selling it. However, we have given it a great "home"!

Two plates sold for \$1900 and \$750, the lesser having sharp points; along with a couple of bowls at \$650 and \$675 during the auction season of 2002.

On July 16, 2003, a very FINE plate example sold over Ebay for \$1200.

# BROCADED JACK FROST COMPOTE

Brocaded Jack Frost...haven't heard that name before? We recently acquired the pictured compote, not only because it was attractive, but we also had never seen this pattern. Thinking back to childhood, I remembered the design on windows in the wintertime that "Jack Frost" had left, and the pattern on this compote looks like Jack Frost coated the exterior.

Our white compote has a 7 3/4" diameter and stands 4" tall and has pastel pink, green, and gold iridescence. It also features what I believe is called a gold stamping 3/4" band around the exterior top edge that features a flower design band with a row of beading on each side. The foot also has a gold ring on the edge, but no band. The pattern, which is exterior only, appears to be pressed rather than etched, and is on the foot and on the bowl, but there is an unpatterned area on the stem, and no pattern where the gold band runs around the top edge. The interior is smooth.

Researching has not led to a definite manufacturer. There are two companies that I have found that possibly could have made the Brocaded Jack Frost compote, but neither are a complete certainty.

In Hazel Marie Weatherman's <u>Colored Glassware of the Depression 2</u>, in the section devoted to the Monongah Glass Co. of Fairmont, W.V., there is a compote shape, No. 7783-7" that is very similar to our compote. This is pictured in the etched Roseland pattern display. This 7" compote is the only one pictured, but perhaps there were other compotes available that weren't featured in this advertisement. Whether this company produced iridescent glassware is uncertain, but possible.

Perhaps another attribution could be the Cambridge Glass Co., who, of course, was known to have produced carnival glass. In a reprint from a 1934 catalog that appears in the National Cambridge Collectors, Inc. book on Cambridge reprints, there are three compotes that have the same general shape as our compote, and were available in a 6", 7", and 8".

As you can see, neither company has an exact size or pattern match to our compote, so attribution cannot be assigned. If anyone has any information or other pieces with this Brocaded Jack Frost pattern, please let me know.

# **DON'T ROCK THE BOAT!**

The newer generation would take one look at the beautiful, multicolored iridescence on this amethyst piece of carnival glass, and say, "That Thistle Banana Boat ROCKS!" They would be right, because the color is great! But we would agree because the feet are 'splayed' and the boat actually does ROCK! One of the four legs on this piece is fully '4" above the table top.


We propose that there is a good reason that so few carnival shapes have four feet... it is more difficult to make them sit level. If a piece has three feet with some irregularity, the piece will simply lean a little bit, but four feet with irregularity makes the piece tilt back and forth. Awkward for serving some types of food, to say the least, especially with liquid that might slosh over the side. My husband and I surmised that one foot on our banana boat must have been 'bumped' or 'pressed' out of position while the glass was still warm causing it to turn slightly and raise up off the table. Thus, it rocks.

"Thistle" was made by Fenton as two completely different patterns, in two completely different shapes. The pattern on <u>Bowls and Plates</u> has graceful thistles and leaves flowing around the face of a realistic pattern. The exterior is usually plain and the bowls are found in all the usual colors, with aqua and vaseline considered rare. The plates were made in amethyst, green, and marigold (2 known) and ALL are considered rare. Recently, someone has claimed to have the only blue "Thistle" plate known.

The <u>Banana Boat</u> (pictured) is oblong and massive in size, with four large thistles placed along the sides inside the boat. There is a 'marie' under the bowl that does not touch the table, which must have made the glass easier to maneuver in the manufacturing process. Without the feet, this boat would have set nicely on the table. Instead, there are four feet, with one placed on each of the four 'sides' of the bowl, not on the four 'corners', making it more awkward. It appears that a four-part mold was used and our boat shows the mold seams running through the feet, which must be the reason for the foot placement. The resource books indicate that the iridescence is usually strong and colorful (like ours) with the exterior pattern of "Waterlily and Cattails" being bold and appropriate for the banana boat size. Colors listed are marigold and blue, with amethyst and green considered scarce. Even so, prices remain comparatively affordable.

How many other pieces of carnival glass are out there in "rock and roll land"? We had a collar-based bowl that was 'warped' and rounded out on the bottom so as to make it not sit flat (and it rocked). This is just another feature of the hand made glass that makes it unique... and fun! My husband gave me this boat for Christmas a few years ago and one foot is definitely warped. Since his sense of humor is also warped, I will always look at this piece and think of him!

## **LOOKING BACK**

#### TUMBLER & MUG NEWS O. JOE OLSON FEBRUARY 25, 1980

An effort to determine "fair market value" of carnival tumblers, for tax and/or insurance purposes, disclosed a wide range among prices listed in current price guides. In fact, in evaluating the worth of tumbler rarities, the difference of opinions is very marked between the Owens price guide, published in 1978, and the 1979-80 Hartung price guide.

The following listings illustrate some of the disparities:

The Owens price guide appeared with a preprint of the tumbler color plates brought out in 1978 by Wallace-Homestead Co., of Des Moines, IA. For the price guide, Owens drew on the resources of five or six tumbler collectors. Each submitted figures/estimates on market values by pattern and color which were the basis of Owens guide.

Mrs. Hartung's latest 1979-80 price guide was regrettably weak on tumbler values. The majority of rare tumblers she did not price because the pattern have not appeared in her books.

Where Owens, in his color book, was able to insert a full color page of rarities which he had not included earlier in the alphabetical order of the work, Mrs. Hartung did not insert prices on any tumblers beyond her ten pattern books.

In addition, several weaknesses and omissions that marred previous Hartung price guide editions were perpetuated in the 1979-80 edition.

For example, Mrs. Hartung again quoted prices on matching tumblers for the two colors in which Starflower pitchers are known, blue and marigold. No matching tumblers are known. They remain "undiscovered."




