# BUZZ SAW CRUETS

The Cambridge Glass Company made the Buzz Saw cruet, the cologne bottle, the Forks cracker jar and the Near-Cut decanter. You might ask what do these four items all have in common? Our answer would have to be, "trying to find the above with the proper tops." In Dave Doty's book "A field Guide to Carnival Glass", his comments on the Buzz Saw cruet read "bear in mind that the stopper is the most difficult to find and may be worth more than the cruet." How true this is.

Another popular Cambridge pattern is an exception to this, as the green Inverted Feather cracker jar can usually be found complete with lid. At a recent auction here in St. Louis, Mo. several auction lots confirmed this observation. Two green Cambridge colognes sold without stoppers, a green Near-Cut decanter sold with a clear stopper, a small sized green Buzz Saw cruet with a clear stopper and a Forks cracker jar without the lid. Our antique mall searches have found that clear Buzz Saw cruets are not that hard to find and we suspect that these other Cambridge patterns, such as the cologne and the rare decanter stoppers are not that hard to find in clear glass either. In fact one lot in this auction sold a badly broken (scotch taped) Imperial Diamond & Sunburst decanter stopper and a Cambridge Near-Cut decanter clear stopper. Price \$15.00, apparently not too scarce in clear.

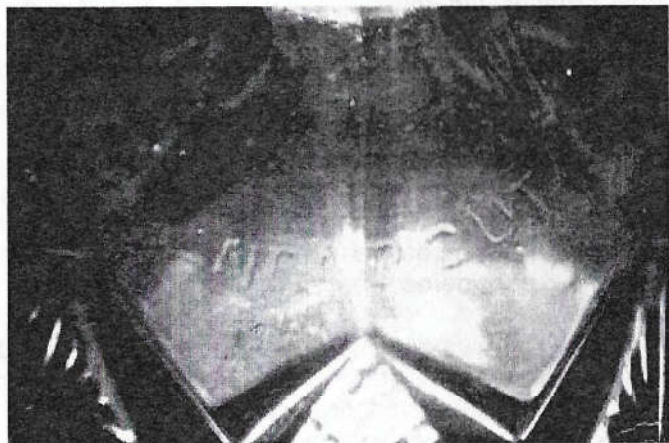
The two cruets pictured are suffering from the same lost stopper syndrome, one with and one without a stopper. The little green cruet is pictured with the larger stopper- less marigold cruet. The larger marigold cruet is the most difficult to find. But neither one can be considered common. And yes, we would be happy to pay more for a marigold stopper than we paid for this cruet. But if you wait until you can find the complete cruet you may never get to own one.

Here is something we just learned on ebay. The small green cruet is signed **NEAR CUT on the inside**. You can see this by holding the cruet and shining a flashlight up thru the bottom while looking down and reading NEAR CUT in the flat areas below the opening. Our marigold cruet is not signed.

We remember an auction several years ago where a small green cruet was being sold and the auctioneer pointed out that if any interested bidder cared to see the stopper to just ask, as the stopper was staying in his pocket until the lot was sold. Now we guess that was just a

precaution. But it does point towards the high desirability of these stoppers and the desperation of many collectors to complete their Cambridge carnival glass pieces. Happy hunting!



## JOCKEY CLUB

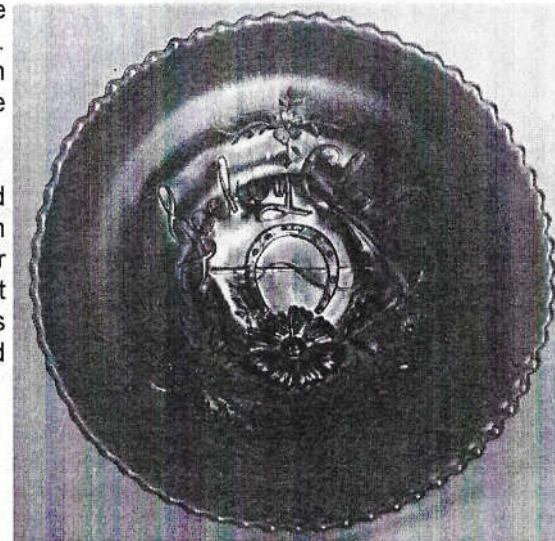
Hm!...Another Good Luck?...This one having a whip? Although not of the horse racing type, the mind skips over to harness racing, but then there are no jockeys in harness racing!

Following some 50 possibilities presented in a computer search, conclusion was reached by John Resnik that Jockey Club was a perfume!?...You weren't ready for that one were you? John tracked down the company into the early 1900's. The identical logo appears on some print advertising from the 1850's. It is known that this product was sold in California, but point of origin had not been established in 1989, when the Lettered Pieces were documented by Mr. Resnik. Just a thought: We don't recall that there was a gift shop at the Del Mar Racetrack, north of San Diego, but perhaps in earlier days there was. A custom prevails whereby ladies attending "First Day" racing at Del Mar try to "outdo" one another by wearing huge, elaborately decorated hats. At the turn-of-the-century, perhaps it was fashionable to wear "Jockey Club Perfume...for Good Luck?"

Northwood manufactured the pieces with their Basketweave exterior.

Some books refer to marigold in this particular pattern. However, our example of the flat plate purchased in Feb. 1995 presents the "hint" of marigold in the iridescence. However, it does have a much lighter amethyst base than some of the lettered pieces. Presented under certain lighting, it could be mistaken for marigold.

A handgrip example sold for \$1000 at auction in 2001, but no other shapes were sold in that manner. All three shapes should be considered very scarce...

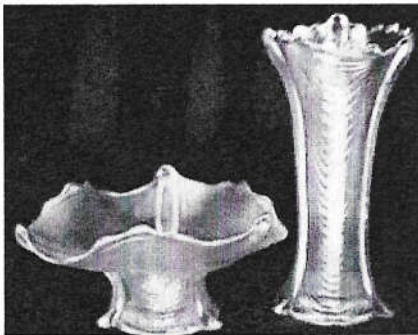


## DRAPERY Vase and Candy

"Pastel Beauty" is an apt description of this simple but elegant pattern. This article will deal mostly with the tri-cornered candy dish and vase that are fashioned from the same mold. They have three prominent ribs that run from the top edge to the base ending in a three-toed finish. These toes are easily chipped, so it is very difficult to find one that is 'perfect.' The drapes also begin at the top edge and continue all the way to the bottom edge at the table surface. Most bear the Northwood signature. The prolific and popular rosebowls in this pattern have three ribs and a collar base and, therefore, are from a different mold.

Although I am not particularly drawn to pastel carnival glass (other than aqua opal, of course), examples of white, ice blue and ice green are a must for the eclectic collector. And, since these colors are found most often in Drapery, it is natural to want examples in my collection. As you can see in the picture (even though it is black and white) these are quite beautiful... the candy dish is ice blue and the 8" vase is ice green. The vase and the candy dish were both made in marigold, white, ice green, ice blue, amethyst, cobalt blue, and green (more difficult). The vase can be found in the additional colors of aqua, teal, lime green, aqua opal, and sapphire blue. Something for everyone – dark and light. Of course, Northwood's pastel lines were introduced in 1912 and continued for a few years, so we can pinpoint production of these pieces.



(It should be noted that there are two Drapery variant vases made by Northwood that have four ribs instead of three. The ribs and drapes appear to start farther down from the top edge on those with a 2- $\frac{3}{4}$ " collar base. Other variants have four ribs starting at the top edge that extend to the bottom to form 'toes' that measure 3- $\frac{1}{4}$ " across.)

The two pieces pictured here are examples of glass that my husband purchased for resale, but 'somehow' found their way into my curio cabinets. It's strange how that happens! (tee hee) Well, it is a resting place for them until we get around to selling them and, in the meantime, my display is all the better for the enjoyment we receive.

## MIRRORED LOTUS

Mirrored Lotus is an aptly named pattern, because around the interior edge, there are twelve lotus flowers and opposite the double row of blocks, divided by crosses with "windows" or "mirrors", is a mirrored image of the same lotus flowers. These pieces feature the Horse Chestnut, aka Berry and Leaf Circle, as an exterior pattern that shows rather well through the front.

This pattern is a product of the Fenton Art Glass Company, but obviously wasn't the most popular in production, because you don't see the pattern that often now. These were produced and reported in limited quantities in bowls, plates, and rose bowls.



David Doty mentions bowls in ruffled or ice cream shape in blue, one in celeste blue, and one in ice green. The Mordini guide features bowls in blue, and one in celeste blue. Edwards and Carwile mention blue, green, marigold and white bowls, and price the ice green and celeste blue. The Whitmyers in their Fenton Glass book picture one that they identify as green.

The 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " plate, which would be the same size as the Horse Medallion and Lions plates, most authors agree, is found very rarely in the celeste blue color. Edwards/Carwile price a marigold one. Whitmyers list and price marigold and blue plates, as well.

Pictured is our white rose bowl. Rose bowls had been reported only in white until a few years ago when a couple of marigold ones were sold. Ours has a diameter of about 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " at the widest, stands about 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " tall, and has a marie, or collar base, about 2  $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Listed in Edwards/Carwile's price guide is a blue rose bowl.

The Whitmyers also say a bonbon is available in marigold, green, blue, and ice blue. Is this shape really available?

It seems hard to imagine that Fenton produced so few of the Mirrored Lotus pattern in all shapes. Perhaps there are more available. If someone has colors or shapes that aren't listed, or can confirm those pieces that are rumored to exist, please send that info to me, or Eleanor Mochel, to be included in a follow-up article.

# Band Hats and Baskets

(Revised and Updated)

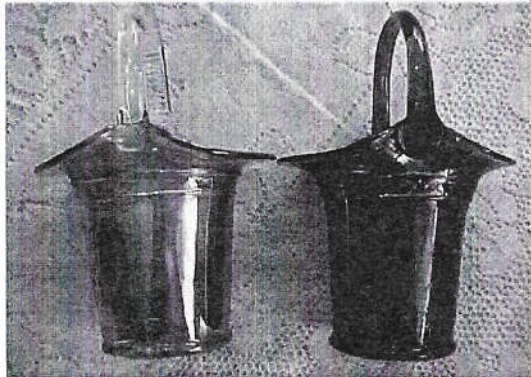

Often called Violet Basket, hats and handled baskets in the Band pattern get little attention, not surprisingly since marigold hats are plentiful, usually light in color, and often lacking in iridescence. Even the hat combined with metal holder, into which the hat fits, are generally passed over without comment. The basket, with an applied glass handle, rarely receives fanfare, either, even though it is actually difficult to find.

Band hats and baskets are known in two types: plain band and lattice band. Near the top of both types are two narrow bands which extend around the circumference of the piece. On the plain-band variety, the area between the bands has been left unpatterned. On the lattice-band variety, the area between the bands is filled in with crosshatching.

Hat shapes come in a greater range of colors than commonly known. Besides marigold, they are known in at least amethyst, pink with marigold overlay, amber/horehound, and – recently reported – powder blue. Plain- and lattice-band hats are known in both marigold and amethyst. The pink, amber/horehound, and powder blue have been reported, to the best of my knowledge, in one variety (plain- or lattice-band) or the other but not both. The hats are abundant in marigold, scarce in amethyst, and rare in pink, amber, and powder blue.

The handled baskets are apparently more restricted in color than the hats. The marigold basket, with a *clear* applied handle, is known in both plain- and lattice-band types. The amethyst basket, with an *amethyst* applied handle, is known to me only in the lattice-band type. I know of no other colors. At least one marigold basket has black hand-written lettering which reads, "Souvenir/Indiana Fair/1924." Baskets are rare in both colors.



I've prepared a table in which hats and baskets in the known colors and band types are displayed. It is my hope that this is a helpful summary of the text.

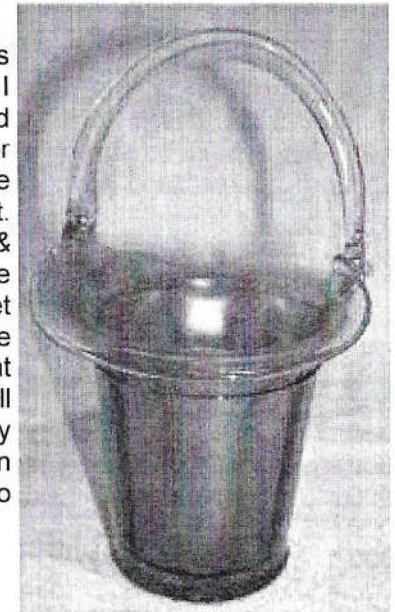

The "violet basket" appellation has always been confusing to me and, I suspect, to others, because it is used both as pattern name and shape. For many years, I thought the hat in the metal frame was the violet basket. However, Carl Burns, in *Dugan & Diamond Carnival Glass*, refers to the basket with applied handle as the violet basket; and Bill Edwards and Mike Carwile, in their *Encyclopedia*, say that both are violet baskets. Surely both will hold a small bouquet of violets, and any of a number of other flowers, nicely. In the long run, though, I believe it best to use Band as the pattern name.

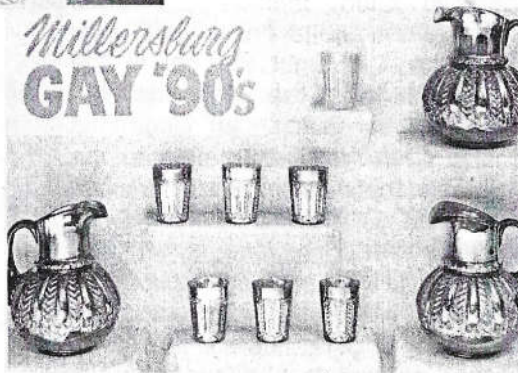
## STORY BY JACK PRITCHARD

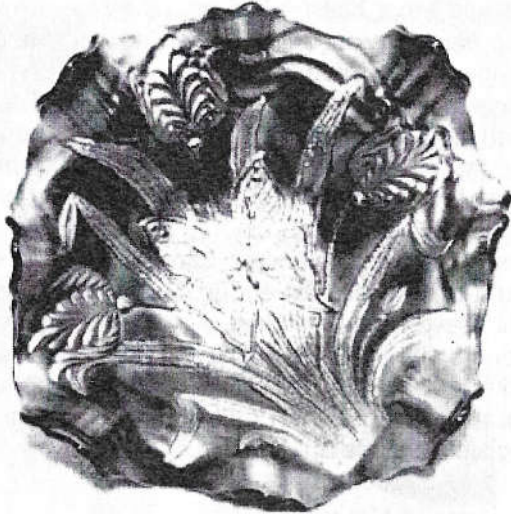

# HOACGA BOARD MEETING

December 16, 2003

The HOACGA Board held their monthly meeting at the home of Charles & Eleanor Mochel in Overland Park on December 16, 2003. Board members present were Bob Grissom, Don Lacock, Cliff Ball, Ann McMorris and Eleanor Mochel. We all enjoyed greatly the hospitality of Charles and Eleanor and especially the opportunity to view their gorgeous carnival glass displays. Eleanor is recovering from her bout with pancreatitis over the Thanksgiving holiday and is gradually getting her strength and energy back.

Treasurer Cliff reported a balance of \$14,174.91 in the HOACGA account and all bills are paid.

The January bulletin will contain preliminary information on the 2004 HOACGA Convention scheduled for April 21-25. The order form for the 2004 Souvenir – a cobalt blue guest set – will appear in the December and future issues. At this time, the delivery date of the guest sets from Fenton is not available but advance orders will be taken and mailed as soon as shipment is received. The January issue will have a listing of 2003 newsletter articles.

2004 Convention planning continued – Bob reported on the program speakers and his contacts with the hotel regarding reducing total room nights, meeting space, banquet service and our picnic and pie events. Speakers will include Stacy Wills, Ed Kramer and Pete Bingham and a special display of Imperial Glass. Other matters discussed – the Britt Award luncheon and room display judging form. Secretary plans to prepare a printed list of rooms with displays in addition to the big sign in board at the registration desk.

After considerable discussion, it was moved and seconded, that the convention registration fee be changed to \$5 per person from \$5 per household. Motion carried.

Other matters discussed – (1) credit card service to membership, and (2) a website. More research needed on both matters before taking action.

Activities planned – The hospitality room for the Reichel New Years January 10 auction will be open on Friday evening, January 9 at the Holiday Inn Express from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. There will be refreshments. The hotel will let us use the Breakfast Buffet area across from the check-in desk at no cost.

Preliminary plans had been to produce a notebook section on BonBons and Nappies but this will be deferred and no notebook section will be produced in 2004. Factors in this decision were cost and production time.

Loss of membership is a matter of great concern to the board. Are there some other things the club could do to retain the current membership and gain new members? Do we need to remind members of their renewal date? Do our current members talk about the club to collectors who are non members? This is your club and the board appeals to you for help in keeping this club viable.

The Board is scheduled to meet with the Embassy Suites personnel and have a food tasting session on February 5, 2004 at 2:00 p.m.

Both Fenton and Northwood made a "Guest Set" in the mid 1920's. Fenton's "First Twenty Five Years" shows a set made in marigold with a royal blue handle. These sets obviously had a functional use. The pitcher for holding the water and a glass for drinking, this was probably one of the few functional pieces of Carnival Glass. These sets were made in several colors, but a very few are available to today, because of their use they had a difficult time of surviving.

As anyone, that has had experience with the administration of any Carnival Glass club, knows that you are constantly trying to find means of providing financial support. All clubs are experiencing a decrease in membership, which effects their financial position, plus the cost of financing the various activities is continually increasing. WE ALL KNOW THAT THE FINANCIAL SUPPORT MUST COME FROM THE MEMBERS. 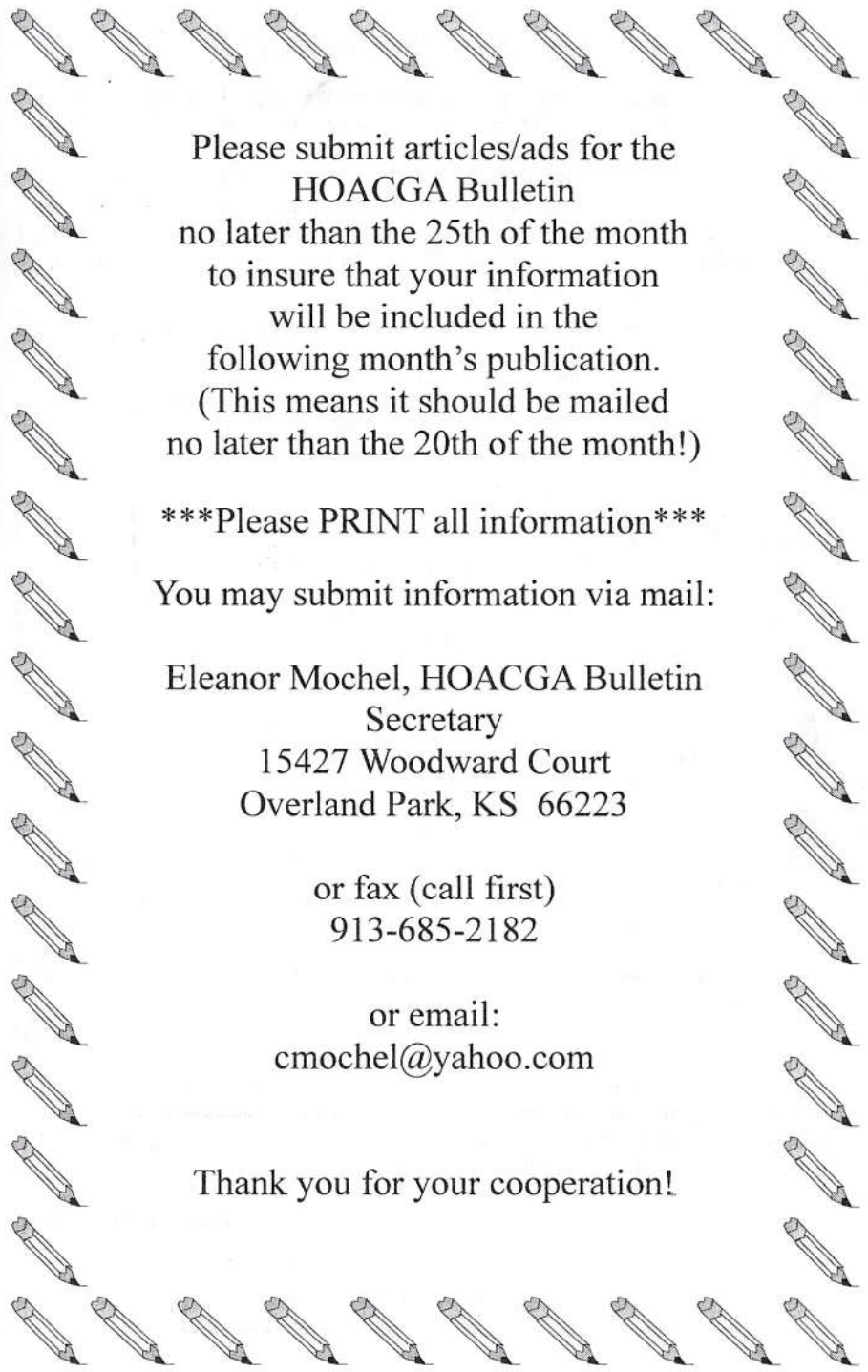

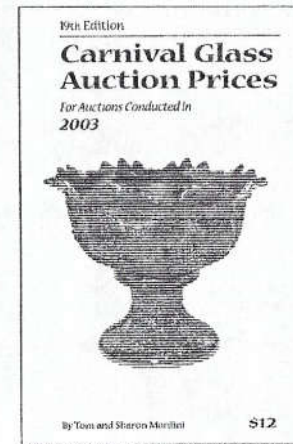
